A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

On this last Sunday of the Church's year we always celebrate the summary of all that we celebrate throughout the year, in every feast, and every day: that Jesus Christ is King-King of the Universe, but King of each one of us too. On Thursday this week, I attended the Archdiocesan Council of Priests. The Council is made up of representatives of the clergy of the Diocese who meet twice a year to consider matters which require decisions, and to advise His Grace the Archbishop. I was there to complete the final stage of the consultation concerning the merging of our three parishes into one, and the canonical closure of St John's church. Having completed this final stage, a draft decree will be presented by the Chancellor to the


Archbishop. Once he issues the decrees, there is a space of ten working days, after which time they come into effect.

As you know, the new Parish name will be "Our Lady of Grace Parish, Kidsgrove, Biddulph and Goldenhill". I will then petition the Holy See so that they can specify the date on which we celebrate our new patronal feast, in addition to the individual church patrons. When I was first drawn to the title of Our Lady of Grace when I first arrived in the parishes, I didn't realise the full significance of the title. The original shrine of Our Lady of Grace was in Ipswich before the Reformation, and the shrine there was a place for great pilgrimages (second only in England to Walsingham), and even royal weddings.

At the destruction of all the Marian shrines in England, at the orders of Thomas Cromwell, all the statues of Our Lady were supposed to be taken to London where they were burnt. The statue of Our Lady of Grace of Ipswich somehow evaded this disgrace, and managed to find its way to Italy, to the town of Nettuno near Rome, where the statue remains to this day. There the Basilica of Our Lady of Grace also contains the casket of the body of St Maria Goretti. What a destination for a future pilgrimage for our parish that would be!

Today's bulletin is only for one week. The full two week bulletin returns next week for the beginning of Advent and the Year of Prayer in preparation for the Jubilee Year.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



St Leonard of Port Maurice 1676-1751

Although destined to become a doctor, Leonard felt the call to be a Franciscan. As a priest he was sent to his hometown. After four years, he began to preach missions around Italy, which he interspersed with times of spiritual renewal. St Alphonsus

called him the 'great missioner of the 18th century'. He would spend up to a month in any place on mission, and drew many people through preaching and hearing confessions. Wherever he went there were great conversions. He spread devotion to the Sacred Heart, the Blessed Sacrament and the Immaculate Conception.
