#### A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

I am writing this message to you having had the inconvenience of having had a stroke—a minor one—during the week. It is making the typing of it rather laborious. The only real effect it has had has been that I cannot use my right hand as effectively as before. It makes writing, for example, very difficult. It was on Wednesday that I noticed I couldn't grip anything with my right hand, and I

couldn't control it, that made me realise there was a problem. A trip to A&E and a CT scan later confirmed that there was a clot somewhere in my brain that was causing it. Anyway, the doctor said I should take time off to let it sort itself out—for up to a month. I'll see how I go on. I am not allowed to drive for at least a month,



so that clips my wings significantly anyway.

In the meanwhile, I am grateful to local priests who will help out until I can return to full working order. Thanks for all the messages from parishioners who found out during the week. I am grateful but won't be able to reply individually as it is quite hard

to type or write. Please pray for my full recovery.

Today, we celebrate the wonderful feast of Corpus Christi. In the words of St John Vianney, if we really understood the Eucharist we would die, not from fear, but from love. The Blessed Sacrament is the real presence of the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ—

in other words, of the whole Jesus, God and Man. We should be reminded of our duty to show reverence to the presence of the Lord. On the back page of the bulletin I've put a few reminders of the things we should do to ensure that we are paying due reverence to the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Please read it!



#### SAINT OF THE WEEK



#### St Gaspar Bertoni 1777-1853

Gaspar, even from the moment of his First Holy Communion, longed for a life of spiritual union with Jesus. This desire led him to enter seminary and to the priesthood. The new priest was entrusted with the care of the youth and to the care of religious sisters, and, in time, the

direction of seminarians was also given to him, as the bishop recognised the poor state of the seminary and the spiritual influence of Fr Gaspar. With two companions he founded a religious congregation which set up a free school. He spent his last 40 years of life suffering poor health which he united to the Lord's suffering.


To dedicate a lamp, please place min donation of £5 in an envelope with preferred church and intention written on the front, and put into the collection or hand to a steward.

#### REVERENCE TO THE BLESSED SACRAMENT



On the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, it is good to be reminded of the practices which we should follow in order to give greater reverence to the Blessed Sacrament:

- Always remember to genuflect to the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle every time you enter church and go into your seat, or pass in front of the main altar. During Mass the focus is the altar, so we bow instead, except after the consecration when the Blessed Sacrament is on the altar and we genuflect.
- When approaching the front of the Communion procession to receive Holy Communion remember to genuflect or bow before receiving Holy Communion.
- There are two ways of receiving Communion: on the tongue and in the hand. If you receive in the hand then it should be in the left hand with the right hand placed underneath, then pick up the host and placing it directly on you tongue. NEVER walk away with the host still in your hand.
- Remember: just because you come to Mass doesn't mean that you have to receive Communion. If you are aware of serious sins, or have already been to Holy Communion twice that day, or you are in a position where you cannot receive Com-

munion (eg divorced and remarried outside the Church) then you should not go to Communion.

- Don't forget that it is a precept of the Church to go to Confession at least once a year. A good confession makes Holy Communion more fruitful.
- Holy Communion calls us to live a life of charity to others, just as the Lord has been generous to us in giving himself
  to us in the Blessed Sacrament.
- Make sure to get to Mass on every Sunday and Holy Day without exception. Try to get to Eucharistic Adoration too.
