A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST



Good Shepherd Sunday, which is the name given to the fourth Sunday of Easter, is the day designated for prayer for vocations to the priesthood. You will have heard His Grace the Archbishop encourage us in the support of our future priests in his pastoral letter this Sunday. Every priest is also a man with a family background, and a life before the priesthood. God, in his wisdom, chooses men with all their

weaknesses and makes them strong through the outpouring of his grace in the Sacrament of Holy Order. Sometimes all that we see with our human eyes is the man, with all the weaknesses that we can see, and fail to see the image of Christ that God makes present in him by the power of his grace. It's a bit like the Eucharist. Without faith, all we see is bread and wine. Through faith we are able to perceive the

reality, which is the presence of Christ. So it is with the priest (and all the other Sacraments!).

St John Vianney used almost shocking language to express the reality of the priesthood. He said that if he were confronted with an angel or a priest, he would bow down to the priest first, because not even an angel can command that God come down from heaven to be present on the altar. This sort of language doesn't sit easily side by side with our knowledge of the sins and failings of priests. But we should not let those failings make us doubt the reality of God's work, who can even take a sinful man and make him a channel of grace. So I appeal to you to pray for your priests, and pray for more vocations.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



St Augustus Schoffler 1822-1851

Augustus joined the Society of Foreign Missions in Paris. After seminary and ordination, he was sent to Vietnam in 1848. In 1850, his superior gave him a particular region to evangelize. A persecution of Christians broke out in 1851. Fr Schoffler was arrested and was impris-

oned. Although he wasn't tortured, the wooden frame around his neck and the shackles, as well as the vermin in the prison, were a particular trial. He was sentenced to death by beheading. After his death his head was thrown in the river and his body buried at the site of martyrdom, but it was recovered and reburied in a Christian village

MAY, MONTH OF OUR LADY: PRAYING FOR MARY'S MEALS

For over ten years, our Partnership of Parishes has promoted the wonderful charity, Mary's Meals, and we have supported the charity with our Christmas crib offerings, sending thousands of pounds each year to help to feed children in a place of education in the developing world.

Money is good, but prayers are better! And so, Mary's Meals are asking that we dedicate Our Lady's month of May to praying for the work of the charity. So this is our time to be generous in time for prayer for Mary's Meals.

During this month we will:

Pray the Rosary for the intentions of Mary's Meals before each of the Saturday evening/Sunday Masses in each of our churches. (6th/7th May Joyful Mysteries; 13th/14th May Luminous Mysteries; 20th/21st May Sorrowful Mysteries; 27th /28th May Glorious Mysteries.
