A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST



Last weekend, we learned the sad news of the death of Bishop David McGough, the Emeritus Auxiliary Bishop for our northern area of the Diocese from 2005 to 2019. He was a true son of Tunstall, and always spoke so affectionately about his home city, and particularly this end of the city. He was a great

friend to our parishes and often helped with supplying for Masses, even when he wasn't doing his official duties. He was a real Biblical scholar, and had a particular love for St Paul. I remember hearing him preach to the seminarians at the English College in Rome, when we were on a parish pilgrimage, and his insight into the Scriptures was fascinating.

I know that everyone will be praying for him as we await news of his funeral, which may be a little time away yet. We will have a Requiem Mass in our parishes too for the repose of his soul once we know when the funeral will be. We surround all the members of the McGough family with love and prayers, recognising that the news was a shock to them.

As we begin Holy Week today, let us really dedicate this week to the Lord and not be distracted by other things which can wait. It was a great preparation to have our penitential service on Thursday evening with a good participation of parishioners. I hope that you will all make the effort to come and be part of the celebrations of Holy Week. The liturgy of the Easter Triduum is something quite special. It is worth the effort, even if it means making a sacrifice to

Saint of the Week



Bl Tarsykia Matskiv 1919-1944

Bl Tarsykia was a Ukrainian nun of the Order of the Servant Sisters of Mary Immaculate. She was an ordinary hard-working sister, who dedicated herself to sewing and teaching others the skill. She had entered the convent in 1938. When the Russians were invading Ukraine in

1944, she took her final vows before the chaplain. On 17th July 1944, she answered the door, thinking it was the priest coming to celebrate the Mass. But it was a Russian soldier who suddenly and without warning shot her dead, simply because she was a nun. Pope St John Paul II named her a martyr and beatified her in 2001.



HOLY WEEK & EASTER

Holy Week begins with the celebration of the festive entry of Jesus into Jerusalem on **Palm Sunday**. This is either in the form of a Procession or entrance with blessing of palms at Mass. The rest of the Mass on Palm Sunday becomes more solemn as it commemorates the Passion of the Lord, with the reading of the Passion narrative, this year from St Matthew's Gospel. The three minor days of Holy Week are an opportunity to pray and prepare for the latter part of the week. These are good

The three minor days of Holy Week are an opportunity to pray and prepare for the latter part of the week. These are good days for personal reading of the Passion, attending the devotions or Mass in church, and going to Confession.

The **Easter Triduum** (meaning three days) begins on the evening of **Maundy Thursday** with the Mass of the Lord's Supper. At this Mass we remember how Jesus washed his disciples' feet, how he instituted the Sacrament of the Eucharist and the Priesthood, and then began the drama of his Passion in the Garden of Gethsemane. We are invited to spend time with him in the Garden as we keep watch at the Altar of Repose.

Good Friday is a day of fasting and abstinence. It may be a Bank Holiday but it is **not** a day for celebrations. It is the most solemn day on which we remember and re-enact the Passion of the Lord in the great Liturgy which begins at 3pm, the hour when Jesus died.

On **Holy Saturday** we remain in silence and are invited to keep the fast going if we are able. After the sun sets, we gather for the Solemn Vigil Mass of Easter. The fire is lit, and the new Paschal Candle consecrated and lit from the fire, representing Christ risen from the dead. The Easter proclamation is sung. We hear readings which tell of the promises made in the Old Testament and their fulfilment in the New. We welcome adults into the church through baptism or reception into full communion. Finally, we celebrate the first Mass of Easter. On **Easter Sunday** we continue the baptism theme, with the renewal of our baptism promises.
