# A Word from the Parish Priest

A Happy Feast of Pentecost to you all. It is quite a month for feast days, as well as being the month of Our Lady. It's hard to keep up with it all!

On the first weekend of May we had two consecutive days of celebrations. On Saturday 4th May, we celebrated the Solemnity of the English

Martyrs at Biddulph. It's a shame a few more people didn't come to enjoy the celebration of Mass, and a lovely buffet lunch. Still, it was more food for those of us who were there! And then, on Sunday 5th May, we held our first May Procession since 2019. It was a beautiful afternoon. We were very blessed with great weather, and a full church. People came together from the parish and the schools, as well as from the local Walsingham Association to honour Our



Blessed Lady in her month. After children from the school crowned the statue of Our Lady of Grace, we went in procession around the garden at St Patrick's, while praying the Holy Rosary, and ended with solemn Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. The food that was brought to share was so plentiful, and the weather so pleasant, that we had people sitting in the garden into the evening. I hope this becomes a fixture, once again, in our Parish diary.

It struck me, at the Procession, that St Patrick's church is somewhere around the geographical centre of our new parish. It is also notable that the image of Our Lady in the garden grotto is not Our Lady of Lourdes, like at most grottoes, but Our Lady of Grace. It seems to me so providential that, back in the Marian Year, called by Pope Pius XII, in 1954, the parishioners at St Patrick's decided to put a statue of Our Lady of Grace there. I think that we should look on that shrine as our parish shrine of Our Lady of Grace. This makes is all the more important that we maintain the weekly Rosary devotions there, which take place on Tuesday afternoons. It would be wonderful if even more people from across the Parish could take part!

## SAINT OF THE WEEK



### Bl John Duns Scotus 1266-1308

John was a Scottish Franciscan friar and priest. He became a great scholar of philosophy and theology, studying in Oxford and Paris. He was responsible for explaining the doctrine of the Immaculate Conception so that it did not take Mary outside of salvation through Christ, which had

been the main objection of theologians. Rather, he explained, Mary received the grace from and in advance of Christ's saving death and resurrection. So, theology was able to catch up with popular devotion. Before a debate, John knelt before and image of Our Lady and prayed: "Allow me to praise you, O Sacred Virgin".

# OUR LADY OF GRACE PART 3



In previous Parish Bulletins, we have learned about the history of the devotion to Our Lady of Grace. We have discovered the devotion to Our Lady of Ipswich whose image is now at Nettuno in Italy, and other images and devotions. Today we come to the best known image of Our Lady of Grace: the image from the Miraculous Medal. This is the image of Our Lady we see in each of our churches.

It was almost midnight when St. Catherine Labouré was awakened by a soft voice, whispering, "Sister, sister, sister." Mysterious events led her to the chapel where the Blessed Mother appeared and sat down near the altar. St. Catherine knelt at her feet, rested her hands in Mary's lap, looked into her eyes, and had a heart-to-heart conversation with her. Later, St. Catherine would refer to that night as "the sweetest moment of my life."

Four months later, in November of 1830, Mary again appeared to St. Catherine at the Rue de Bac Chapel. This time, our Blessed Mother was standing on a globe, with dazzling rays of light streaming from her outstretched hands. Framing the apparition was an inscription: "O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee." When Mary spoke to St. Catherine, she said "Have a medal struck upon this model. Those who wear it will receive great graces, especially if they wear it around the neck. Those who repeat this prayer with devotion will be, in a special manner, under the protection of the Mother of God. Graces will be abundantly bestowed

upon those who have confidence."

With approval of the Catholic Church, the first medals were made in 1832 and distributed in Paris. Only ten of the original medals are known to exist, and one of them is housed at the Miraculous Medal Shrine.

Almost immediately, the blessings that Mary promised showered down on those who wore her medal, and soon all of France was clamouring for what the people referred to as the "Miraculous Medal." Use of the Medal spread from country to country, and, at the time of St. Catherine's death in 1876, more than a billion medals had been made. Today, the Medal is still drawing down from God blessings for body and soul.
