A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST



In today's Sunday liturgy, we hear the Gospel of the Wedding at Cana. This is the third of the three great Mysteries which is celebrated at Epiphany. So, although we are now in Ordinary Time, and the vestments are back to green, we are continuing the celebration of Epiphany, for it is in the ordinary and every-day that God reveals Jesus present to us.

It is significant that Jesus chose to work his first miracle, at his blessed Mother's

request, at a wedding. Jesus chose the place where man is given to woman in marriage as the place where he

wanted to be present with his grace. It is true of family life where that life is consecrated by the Sacrament of Marriage that Jesus comes to be present and works his graces. He takes what we have to offer (like water), and creates of it something more rich and beautiful (like good wine).

It is true also of our parish life. I believe that Jesus wants to come and be present with us and to work among us, bringing new graces. But it means we

have to have the faith enough to bring him what we have to offer, with generosity, and be prepared for him to transform it. It means being challenged not to be content with what we can do, but to welcome Him who can do all things, for each of us, for our parish, for our families.

I want to ask you all if you will help to welcome the young people who will come on a mission trip to our parish from the USA in March. We need hosts who will accommodate pairs of young people during the week 10th to 16th March. We also need people who will prepare an evening meal for them each evening. Please see me if you can help, or contact Teresa in the parish office, and let's welcome them with joy!

SAINT OF THE WEEK



Bl Cyprian Tansi 1903-1964

Bl Cyprian was baptised Michael at the age of 10 in the Igbo region of Nigeria, and educated at the Holy Ghost Fathers' school. He was an altar boy and became a catechist. To the disgust of his family, he entered seminary and was ordained priest, aged 34. In his parish he worked

especially with young couples, and sought to eradicate pagan rituals and was practical in his teaching. Fr Michael found an attraction to monastic life, and after the Holy Year in 1950, he went to Mt St Bernard's Abbey in Leicestershire. He entered and lived a life of great humility and prayer. He was beatified by St John Paul II in 1998.



WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY 18th to 25th January

Most people do not realise that the Week, or Octave, of Prayer for Christian Unity was, originally, a Catholic innovation. Fr Paul Wattson, founder of the Graymoor Franciscan Friars, came up with the idea of praying for the unity of all Christians in one visible Church by linking together the Feast of the Confession of St Peter (no longer in our calendar) on the 18th January with that of the Conversion of St Paul on 25th January. It came to be approved by the Popes, and eventually adopted by the World Council of Christian Churches, which includes Orthodox and Protestant churches too. It was spread through the work of

Fr Paul Couturier, a French priest from Lyon. It is the week in the year when we are called to ask God to bring about the unity of his followers such as Jesus prayed for at the Last Supper: 'That they may all be one.' It is a time to pray for the unity of our Catholic Church, made up of so many races, cultures and differences, that it may be at one. It is also a time to pray that we may not just work together, but find a true unity, with all other Christians.



Alpha is coming soon! We are starting a new series of Alpha meetings on Saturday mornings at 9am at St Joseph's Goldenhill beginning on 2nd February 2019. It will be 8 weeks long and we really look forward to seeing you there.

NEXT SUNDAY'S GOSPEL

Luke 1:1-4,4:14-21

Seeing that many others have undertaken to draw up accounts of the events that have taken place among us, exactly as these were handed down to us by those who from the outset were eyewitnesses and ministers of the word, I in my turn, after carefully going over the whole story from the beginning, have decided to write an ordered account for you, Theophilus, so that your Excellency may learn how well founded the teaching is that you have received. Jesus, with the power of the Spirit in him, returned to Galilee; and his reputation spread throughout the countryside. He taught in their synagogues and everyone praised him. He came to Nazara, where he had been brought up, and went into the synagogue on the Sabbath day as he usually did. He stood up to read and they handed him the scroll of the prophet Isaiah. Unrolling the scroll he found the place where it is written: The spirit of the Lord has been given to me, for he has anointed me. He has sent me to bring the good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives and to the blind new sight, to set the downtrodden free, to proclaim the Lord's year of favour. He then rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the assistant and sat down. And all eyes in the synagogue were fixed on him. Then he began to speak to them, 'This text is being fulfilled today even as you listen.'

KEY VERSE: "This text is being fulfilled today even as you listen".

TO KNOW: Luke began the account of Jesus' public ministry with his proclamation in the synagogue in Nazareth. As Jesus' fame spread throughout the land, he was often called upon to read and comment on the scriptures. Any well instructed male member of the assembly could be called upon to read and interpret the scriptures. On one occasion, Jesus was given the scroll of the prophet Isaiah to read. The passage spoke of the restoration of Israel through the work of God's anointed one (the Messiah in Hebrew or Christos in Greek). Jesus announced that Isaiah's words applied to his own mission. He had been anointed by God's Spirit to announce a Jubilee year of God's favour, and to bring good news to the poor, the oppressed and afflicted. God had anointed him to bring liberation and salvation to all who believed the good news. The people were amazed by his teaching.

TO LOVE: Lord Jesus, anoint me with your Spirit to proclaim hope to the distressed.

TO SERVE: In what ways does my parish care for the poor and suffering?
