## A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST



This week we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension on Thursday. The forty days since Easter remind us of the period of time when Jesus was very present to his disciples, as he appeared to them in bodily form. The Ascension has a very consoling dimension as we see the Lord glorified and enthroned at the right hand of the Father. However, for the disciples of Jesus, it was a moment of trial. Once again they were left without the physical presence of the Lord.

But this time, Jesus had given them the immense task of completing his mission by bringing the news of the Kingdom of God to all the world. They felt completely unprepared to fulfil this task, and so retired to the seclusion of the Upper Room once again.

We also, in our own day, have been given the same mission. We too, confronted with a world which seems to have turned against God, and does not want to hear about Him, may feel completely helpless too. Even confronted with the reality of the loss of faith in our own families we often feel powerless to do anything other than by continuing our quiet example of faith in our own lives. And yet, we must have faith that the Holy Spirit is still as powerful today as ever He was.

We need to take note of what the apostles did, and copy them. It is to return to the intimacy of the Upper Room, accompanied as they were by Our Lady, and pray for the Holy Spirit to come to us in new and fresh ways. If we are faithful, God can still do wonderful things with us today, and bring his Church to new life, as He has in so many different ways throughout the history of the Church.

## Saint of the Week



## St Maria Dominic Mozzarello 1837-1881

St Maria Dominic was a religious sister who was a co-founder of the Daughters of Our Lady Help of Christians. She was born near Genoa, Italy, and joined a pious association of Mary Immaculate. She came under the influence of St John Bosco, who

then helped her to form the religious congregation. A bout of typhoid made this a difficult time for St Maria but she became the first superior general of the Salesian sisters, dedicated to the education of poor girls and supporting the educational work of St John Bosco. By 1900, there were almost 800 foundations of the sisters.

## THE PENTECOST NOVENA

When the Lord Jesus had ascended into heaven, he promised that the Holy Spirit would come to give the Apostles courage so that they could fulfil the commandment that he gave them, to go out to the whole world to make disciples of all nations. The Apostles met from then until Pentecost, together with Mary, the Mother of God, and others, in the Upper Room, praying for the Holy Spirit to come. Each year, we keep the nine days between Ascension and Pentecost as the Novena of Pentecost, praying that the Holy Spirit will come upon the Church in this our day. Indeed, these nine days are why we make novenas of prayer. Please join in praying the Novena of the Holy Spirit this year with us. Pray these prayers each day from Friday this week until Saturday, the vigil of Pentecost:

O Lord Jesus Christ, Who, before ascending into heaven, did promise to send the Holy Spirit to finish Your work in the souls of Your Apostles and Disciples, deign to grant the same Holy Spirit to me that He may perfect in my soul, the work of Your grace and Your love. Grant me the Spirit of Wisdom that I may despise the perishable things of this world and aspire only after the things that are eternal, the Spirit of Understanding to enlighten my mind with the light of Your divine truth, the Spirit of Counsel that I may ever choose the surest way of pleasing God and gaining heaven, the Spirit of Fortitude that I may bear my cross with You and that I may overcome with courage all the obstacles that oppose my salvation, the Spirit of Knowledge that I may know God and know myself and grow perfect in the science of the Saints, the Spirit of Piety that I may find the service of God sweet and amiable, and the Spirit of Fear that I may be filled with a loving reverence towards God and may dread in any way to displease Him. Mark me, dear Lord, with the sign of Your true disciples and animate me in all things with Your Spirit. Amen.

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth.

O, God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit, did instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant that by the same Holy Spirit we may be truly wise and ever enjoy His consolations, Through Christ Our Lord, Amen.

Come, Holy Spirit, renew Your wonders in this our day, as by a new Pentecost. Grant to Your Church that, being of one mind and steadfast in prayer with Mary, the Mother of Jesus, and following the lead of blessed Peter, it may advance the reign of our Divine Saviour, the reign of truth and justice, the reign of love and peace. Amen.
