A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST



Today is the Sunday of the Word of God. Pope Francis instituted this day in the calendar so that we could better appreciate the place of the Bible in the Church's life, and more personally in each of our lives. Whenever we talk about the Faith being brought to a particular place, we speak of the 'evangelisation' of that place and people. That literally means the 'Gospelling' of a place.

In our area of the Midlands, we can thank St Chad for being a very effective evangelist of the people. Since he came to the Midlands, the Christian faith has continued to be believed and practised. In the picture above, you can see a photo of the St Chad's Gospel, an illuminated Gospel which dates from the eighth century, to the time when Christianity was still new to this part of England.

This year, the Sunday of the Word of God also falls within the Octave (or Week) of Prayer for Christian Unity. Although we may understand the Word of God in the Bible differently from other Christians, the actual text, to the most part, unites us. We Catholics need to learn to study and pray the Word of God in Scripture, and we can take inspiration in the way that many non-Catholic Christians do so.

I would like to thank everyone from the Parish who came to support me for the funeral of my dear mother, Jean. I ask you to continue to pray for her, and for the family. I shall be going to the winter session of the Society of St John Vianney today, in Ars. I am grateful for the days away after the funeral. SAINT OF THE WEEK



St Ulfrid d. 1028

St Ulfrid was an Englishman, who felt called by God to leave his own country and go first to Germany and then to Sweden to preach the Christian faith there. As a bishop in Sweden, he was very successful in his mission, and made many converts. In his zeal for the destruction of all devilish cults, he not only preached against the old pagan religion, but also attacked and destroyed an old statue of the pagan god Thor. This provoked the anger of the pagans who rushed at him and killed him on the spot. They took his dismembered body and threw it into a marsh. He is venerated as a martyr on 18th January.

Mary's Meals Thank you to you all for your generosity to the crib appeal for Mary's Meals once again this year. You raised £4945 for the charity, of which £2220 was gift aided. The Bible in the Catechism

On this Sunday of the Word of God, it is good to read what the Catechism of the Catholic Church says about Scripture, the Bible. This is a point where the Catholic Church has a slightly different understanding than the Protestant churches:

105 God is the author of Sacred Scripture. "The divinely revealed realities, which are contained and presented in the text of Sacred Scripture, have been written down under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit."

"For Holy Mother Church, relying on the faith of the apostolic age, accepts as sacred and canonical the books of the Old and the New Testaments, whole and entire, with all their parts, on the grounds that, written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, they have God as their author, and have been handed on as such to the Church herself."

106 God inspired the human authors of the sacred books. "To compose the sacred books, God chose certain men who, all the while he employed them in this task, made full use of their own faculties and powers so that, though he acted in them and by them, it was as true authors that they consigned to writing whatever he wanted written, and no more."

107 The inspired books teach the truth. "Since therefore all that the inspired authors or sacred writers affirm should be regarded as affirmed by the Holy Spirit, we must acknowledge that the books of Scripture firmly, faithfully, and without error teach that truth which God, for the sake of our salvation, wished to see confided to the Sacred Scriptures."

108 Still, the Christian faith is not a "religion of the book". Christianity is the religion of the "Word" of God, "not a written and mute word, but incarnate and living". If the Scriptures are not to remain a dead letter, Christ, the eternal Word of the living God, must, through the Holy Spirit, "open (our) minds to understand the Scriptures."

109 In Sacred Scripture, God speaks to man in a human way. To interpret Scripture correctly, the reader must be attentive to what the human authors truly wanted to affirm, and to what God wanted to reveal to us by their words.

110 In order to discover the sacred authors' intention, the reader must take into account the conditions of their time and culture, the literary genres in use at that time, and the modes of feeling, speaking and narrating then current. "For the fact is that truth is differently presented and expressed in the various types of historical writing, in prophetical and poetical texts, and in other forms of literary expression."

111 But since Sacred Scripture is inspired, there is another and no less important principle of correct interpretation, without which Scripture would remain a dead letter. "Sacred Scripture must be read and interpreted in the light of the same Spirit by whom it was written."
