# A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST



It is particularly poignant, this year, to be keeping Remembrance Sunday at a time when war and violence dominate the news. The war in Gaza has displaced the war in Ukraine from the airwaves, but the conflict in the east of our continent continues to rumble on.

When we come to remember the dead of the World Wars, and pray for them, many of us can name family members who are among those who died. In more recent wars, our casualties in conflicts have been much fewer. However, there are those who continue to lose their lives defending their homelands, their families and their way of life. Remembrance Sunday is not a day to glorify war at all. It is a day when we remember the dead, but also remember that the reason they died was for liberty and human dignity, for patriotism and defending their families and communities. Our task, in our generation, is to honour the memory of the fallen

# by pursuing peace and reconciliation between peoples. It was remarkable, the way in which the formerly enemy nations of Europe managed to become friends and allies in such a short time after the Second World War. Let us pray that the present wars will end, not in the fragile peace of a ceasefire or stand off. but in a real peace which recognises that people of every nation are all brothers and sisters in the creation of God.

The Church is a constant sign of the reconciliation and peace which Our Lord Jesus Christ won for our human race. He died and rose again, and gave the Spirit so that we are in close communion with people of every nation. May the Church become a sign of the hope of peace for all the world.

# SAINT OF THE WEEK



## St Josaphat of Polotsk 1580-1623

Josaphat was an eastern rite bishop who died as a martyr for Christian unity as he tried to achieve unity between the Catholic and Orthodox churches. When the Archbishop of Kyiv and five other bishops tried to reunite with Rome, Josaphat was a voice of peace. Influenced by the Jesuits, he sought communion between East and West. As a monk, Josaphat desired the reform of monastic life, and tried to make the life more rigorous, with mixed results. His whole life was one of reconciliation and peace. When he became Bishop of Polotsk, he tried to unite his Diocese to Rome. However, he was martyred for his attempt.
