SAINT OF THE WEEK



St Etheldreda (Audrey) 636-679

Etheldreda, or Audrey, was a princess of East Anglia, who was married to a tribal king, Tondberct. They had a chaste marriage, and her husband died only three years later. She was married again, this time to a prince of Northumbria. When he became king he wanted to enforce his marital rights, while Etheldreda wanted to take up religious life. She fled to Ely, and the king married another women, leaving Etheldreda free to become a nun, and she founded a double monastery (monks and nuns) at Ely. After her death, her body remained incorrupt and her clothing had miraculous powers.
