A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

This week, I am sharing with you the way in which the Deanery visitation is going to be implemented in our parishes. Since the publication of the report, which was made available to you at the end of July, I have looked at the recommendations made for our parishes, and made a proposal to the Archbishop of the way forward. He has approved of this, and so I am now letting you know what will be happening.

The report recommended that the three parishes be amalgamated as one single parish. As you will already realise, the process for this to happen has already begun, as I put this forward for consultation with you two weeks ago. The Archbishop is very keen that this should go ahead, and that it should be done without delay.

At the final meeting for the Deanery Visitation is was announced that two of our four churches would be closing: St John's and St Patrick's. I am sad to say that I do think that St John's Kidsgrove has to close. The fact is that the Saturday evening congregation has dwindled after COVID. The school is now vacant, as is the presbytery. The church and grounds are beginning to deteriorate. In spite of the willingness of parishioners, there are not the adequate resources to maintain the site. The first stage in closure is the stopping of the celebration of Mass. And so, sadly, the last Saturday evening Mass at St John's will be on 28th October. If parishioners wish, there can be a final thanksgiving Mass on that date, or on another date.

The situation of St Patrick's is somewhat different. It is more manageable as a site, and is well maintained. And so, with the agreement of the Archbishop, I have decided to postpone the closure of St Patrick's to be reviewed in a year's time. With the loss not only of Kidsgrove but other Saturday evening Masses in the area, from 5th November, the Sunday evening Mass will cease, and Mass at Packmoor will be on Saturday evening, at the new time of 5.30pm.

There is no change to the provision at St Joseph's and English Martyrs'.

I hope this lends some clarity, and I hope that, following these changes, we will be able to come together as one parish, with a renewed sense of purpose and a common vision.

St Remigius (Remy) 437-533

St Remigius was the Bishop of Rheims is France, and is renowned for his wisdom, learning and miracles attributed to his intercession. He is also well known for the length of his time as bishop, achieving seventy years. He had become a hermit and his piety and learning became well

known an early age, and at the age of 22 (too young to be a priest never mind a bishop) he was chosen to be the Bishop of Rheims, and was ordained priest and bishop. He spread the Gospel to the Frankish people, and was fierce is opposing the Arian heresy. God gave him the particular gift of miracles which aided him in his ministry.

CONSULTATION ON PARISH MERGER

As you will have seen in the report on the Visitation of the North Staffs Deanery, it has been proposed that our three parishes of English Martyrs', St Joseph's and St John's should merge to become one single parish. This would mean that the present 'Our Lady of Grace Partnership of Parishes' would become 'Our Lady of Grace Parish'. This process in Canon Law requires that the people of the parishes be consulted.

It is important to note that this process of merging the parishes is a discrete process from that of closing any of the churches. For details of what it entails, please see the last bulletin, for 17th September.
